Week 3 Autumn 2 2024

The children have continued to learn about the festival of Diwali through the story of Rama and Sita. They listened to the story and then used a story template to write the story to create their own book about the story. They also made a fact file about Diwali. They worked with their EYFS friends to reenact the story. They followed a set of instructions to make a symmetrical patterned Rangoli lantern out of card and paper and we used these and the EYFS lamps to help guide Rama and Sita home.

The children have been working hard on their addition using the part, part, whole models and learning about fact families and number bonds within 10.

In Science this week we have continued looking at the weather, we have been recording the weather as a year group and what a week it has been! Snow, black ice and sun all in one week. We used a thermometer to find the daily temperature, a rain gauge to measure the rain and Leopard year 1's found out about the wind and clouds each day. We also looked at what clothes we would wear in Autumn and what happens to deciduous trees in Autumn.

In our topic we have been looking at some artefacts from Victorian times and been playing some games that Victorian children might have played. We sorted out pictures of toys into a Venn diagram, the children also made a peg doll to take home. Do pop in and see all the work they have done in their topic books at open door - the children really love sharing their work. Next week they will be having a visit from the History Van Lady !

We have also started learning the songs for our nativity with the other Year 1's and EYFS, don't forget to save the dates for the performances on Tuesday 10th or Wednesday 11th December. Details on how to get tickets will be out soon.
