Week 6 Spring 1 2025

The children have had a busy week listening to Grandad, our class puppet tell them traditional tales and then they worked really hard to plan their own story using story cubes. These help them choose a setting, characters and something that will help their character overcome the dilemma! The children then used their plan to write their story. Once finished they illustrated the story and shared it with their EYFS friends in Tigers.

This week in maths the children have been looking at doubles and starting to think about subtraction within 20. They have really enjoyed the practical activities and then using what they have learnt to answer questions.

In Science we completed our topic on seasons (Autumn to Winter) by finding out what the children have learnt and then they had fun cutting and sticking a figure - dressing them for Winter.

In our topic work this week we have been looking at hot deserts around the world, finding out what it would be like in that habitat and what plants and animals are adapted to live there. The children chose an animal to find out about their adaptations and then later in the week they painted a hot desert habitat and desert animal all by themselves. Do pop in and see their display after half term. We will be focussing on Rainforest habitats in Spring 2, learning about that amazing habitat and why they are so important to us all.

They children had an ILP (Independent Learning Project) sent home this week with a variety of ideas that the children might like to choose from and try at home. They are then going to bring in their project at the end of Spring 2, as we finish our habitat topic, and they are going to share with parents at an assembly on Monday 31st March at 2.30pm.
