Wow what a fun packed week we have had this week!

We have been celebrating British Science Week - the theme this year is change, we have been thinking about changes in the world around us. The children have thought about what science is and what a scientist does and over the week they have taken part in lots of different activities and experiments and been scientists themselves. They had great fun making cornflour slime which was very messy but great fun! They also took part in a variety of other experiments which included seeing what happens to celery when put in coloured water, finding out if you can change the size of a sweet by putting it in water and also seeing what changes occur to sugar coated sweets when you add water to them. These all linked to changes as we waited to see if they changed and why. There were lots of predictions and some surprising results. We also got to see the results of the cress experiment we had set up last week. The seeds that had had water, light and soil all grew as they should, what surprised the children was that the ones with water and soil but no light still grew, (though not the expected colour). The children then helped plant two pots to take home and look after, one with Giant Sunflower seeds and the other with an anemone bulb - we look forward to hearing how they do under the children's care!

We also really enjoyed our visit from 'Fizz-Pop' who came to do science activities with the whole school, we got to enjoy the whole school assembly about rainbow bubbles - it was very exciting! In Tigers we had a fantastic time learning about air. We took part in lots of different activities testing out our lung capacity, using an air cannon to knock over cups, having a go at blow football and making a spinning helicopter to take home.

We have had fun with our story 'Jack and the Beanstalk' joining in with the repeating refrains and remembering how the story is ordered. The children made their own zig zag book of the story to take home and share with their families. We also looked at the life cycle of a bean and how it grows from a seed into a plant.

We ended the week by meeting 2 new born lambs who were just a few days old, a big thanks to Wilf's Dad and Wilf who taught us lots about them.

We also continued to learn about composition of number and were introduced to time in maths and had lots of practise with our letter formation, alongside continuing to work on our phonics and reading skills.
