### Week 4 Spring 2 2025

In our maths we continue to learn about composition of number and recognition of 2D and 3D shapes. We are also practising our letter formation working on forming the letters in families.

As part of our PSHE topic on 'Healthy Me' we have been talking about a balanced diet and finding out where our food comes from and how it gets onto our plates. We looked at purple sprouting broccoli - finding out how this broccoli we eat gets to our plates - we made our own mini book about this and then all got to taste some purple sprouting broccoli. The children who liked it thought it was delicious! We were also lucky to have Finley and his mum show us how they make scotch eggs that they sell in their shops - the children had lots of questions to ask them both and then the children were offered the chance to try some. Again those that liked it thought it was delicious - though not as much as Mr Osborn who absolutely LOVED it!

We have been doing lots of writing this week including in our Early Morning Activity Books, each of us thinking carefully about our sentence wish list - thinking about what we want to write, how to make it into a sentence and then using our phonics and sight words to write our ideas down. We are all working very hard on using finger spaces and putting a capital letter at the beginning and a full stop at the end.

In our phonics this week we have been focusing on reading words with -ing at the end and also finding out about compound words and tackling these with our ever grow phonic skills.

As part of our topic about plants (What's in the garden?) we found out which were the different parts of plants that we eat - we were amazed to find that we eat some roots, some stems, some leaves and some flowers and fruits! Hopefully this might inspire more vegetable eating at lunchtime. We also found out about the different parts of a flowering plant and made our own picture.

We finished the week with Red Nose Day where we learnt about this fund raising day, the theme this year is that fun has big powers to make a big difference. The children made themselves a funny nose picture and we thought about things that make us smile and laugh. We also talked about how the money they are helping raise helps make other people smile by helping them live their best lives.
