Week 4 Autumn 1 2025

Well done to our EYFS friends for another full week of school - we have had a few Super Suns on our daily challenge and everyone is trying hard. We are so proud of all of them.

They are now getting used to our daily routines and timetable and were introduced to the daily maths sessions we do.

They enjoyed our PSED time with Jigsaw Jenny and we played a game to help them get to know the names of all the children in their year group.

The children have also continued with their phonics time in which they will learn the sounds and names of the letters and then begin to learn to blend them together to read words. Last week they brought home this half term's phonemes to practise with information on games to play at home and a sheet explaining the correct pronunciation and grapheme formation. Don't worry all will be explained at the Reading meetings next week on the 6th or 8th of October, but do come and ask if you have any questions. We have started looking at nursery rhymes and the children are working on their own nursery rhyme book. They have also been creating with a nursery rhyme theme. They each made a spider web plate that they have taken home to share and have been practising their creating and colouring skills by drawing their own Humpty Dumpty to go in our class nursery rhyme book.

The children also continued working on our morning 'Rainbow Card Activities' using the card in their tray to record which activities they have tried over the week. This encourages the children to try a whole range of activities rather than sticking to one favourite activity.

In topic this week we looked at all the different dinosaurs and then the children went on an adventure to explore to find a nest of dinosaur eggs! The children then all worked together to discover what was inside them - there were frozen ice eggs, eggs that dissolved in vinegar and ones that had to be broken to get the baby dinosaurs out. It was a great chance to talk all about the dinosaurs they knew as well as starting to work as a team.
