Another busy week in Tigers.

The children started this busy week by each icing a biscuit (kindly made by Mrs Booth and Miss Pettett) ready for the sponsored walk the next day.

On Tuesday they took part in a sponsored walk to Chatsworth with EYFS and the Year 2's in aid of Children in Need. We were very lucky with the weather and the children all did amazingly well. We were met in Chatsworth grounds by Mrs Shore, who had a hot chocolate drink and their iced biscuit ready and waiting for them (thank you Mrs Shore!), after a short play they managed the walk back (if a little slower!).

They also took part in activities aimed at helping them to further understand Remembrance Day and why we have this special day. The Year 1 children made themselves a poppy to take home, it involved them following a set of instructions, which they did really well. They also created some very striking pictures using water colours - do come and look at our display, which shows some of their work. They took part in a whole class 'Big Art' project using their own bodies to create a large scale poppy outside in the Infant garden. They also wrote about some of the reasons we have Remembrance Day. The children took part in the 2 minute silence with all of the Tigers and Leopards whilst on our sponsored walk and then later with the rest of the school whilst listening to Helen play her cornet.

In science this week we have been looking at the weather and how it changes and how we can find out about the weather through forecasts and learning about weather symbols.

We have also been thinking about the season of Autumn and the children worked together to think about adjectives that could be used to describe things that we see, hear, feel, taste and touch in Autumn. They will use these to write group poems next week about Autumn.

The children finished the week by taking part in our EYFS and KS1 enterprise fund raising for Children in Need, they made themselves a Pudsey badge to wear and came to school wearing a range of Pudsey clothes! In the afternoon they helped run the book and toy stalls and then had a go on the games run by the Year 1s and 2s. A huge thanks to the parents from Tigers and Leopards who then also ran a cake bake after school with all money raised going to the Children in Need collection. We will let you know how much was raised overall. It is an important event as not only is it fun but also helps the children to think about helping others outside of our class, which again are important lessons for life.
