A much needed quieter week in Tigers!

The children have been working hard on their subtraction and addition using the part, part, whole models and learning about fact families and number bonds within 10.

In Science this week we have continued looking at the weather, we have been recording the weather as a year group and what a week it has been! Near freezing temperatures, ice and sun all in one week. We used a thermometer to find the daily temperature, a rain gauge to measure the rain and Leopard year 1's found out about the wind and clouds each day. We also looked at what clothes we would wear in Autumn, what happens to deciduous trees in Autumn and what celebrations are held in Autumn.

We also used our Autumn ideas that we gathered last week to help the children write a poem about our Autumn senses. The children worked in groups and we focused on finding adjectives to describe our Autumn ideas. Do come and look at our class book about Autumn poems. The children enjoyed some Autumn art including learning how to draw a hedgehog and to reorder a hedgehog puzzle.

The children have also started on the decorations for the school Christmas tree that will be in the Bakewell parish church. We will give you details of this nearer the time.

In our topic we have been looking at the different places of worship that different religions use. We focused on Christians and their churches and Muslims and mosques. The children really found it interesting to see the similarities and differences found in these places of worship.

We have also started learning the songs for our nativity with the other Year 1's and EYFS, don't forget to save the dates for the performances on Tuesday 9th or Wednesday 10th December. Details on how to get tickets will be out soon.
