The children took part in our first church service of the year 'Harvest' down at St. Anne's church, it was a lovely service with the rest of the school and a huge thanks for all the food donations given.

In topic this week we looked at some of the inventions Victorians are famous for, these include flushing toilets, ice cream and motor cars to name but a few. After looking at how these looked in Victorian times they then found their modern day equivalent. It was a really interesting lesson.

In science we continued our work on this terms topic on 'Animals (including humans)' by thinking about the 5 senses. The children completed the senses games they started last week, these included using their sense of smell to identify smells hidden in tubs, tasting of different flavor crisps and fruit and the one where they had to identify objects through touch. The children then started some simple recording about how they have used their senses through these various explorations.

In Maths this week they have been looking at the language of greater than, less than and equal to. It was quite a tricky topic working out and recognizing the signs for greater than and less than but the children had lots of fun using practical objects to help them.

In RE they watched a short animation showing the Christian creation story and again discussed what they thought about this. They completed their creation story wheel and have taken them home to retell the story to their families.

In English we have continued to look at rhyming words and the children helped complete their Nursery Rhyme book for their EYFS friends. Their final contribution to the book was a piece of writing and drawing naming their favourite rhyme and saying why. We then created the front cover and the content page and talked about how books are numbered. Do pop and see this book next week it is on the rack we use to hold all the books the children make as authors. They also got to take part in a special assembly where the newly revamped library was revealed, they have already been into the library and chosen a book to bring home Tuesday afternoon saw forest school being moved up to school due to unusually bad weather but the children still had great fun as they were suitably dressed for the weather. They also got to enjoy a drink of hot chocolate and a biscuit to round off their rather soggy afternoon. We finished the week with school photographs which luckily took place at the beginning of the day!
