They continued to work on their handwriting this week has been the ladder letter family and as always we have encouraged them to think about their pencil grips, sitting position and anchoring the paper correctly as well as working on how to form those letters and size and position them on handwriting lined paper.

We continue to work with their phonics and other reading skills through individual and group reading. As well as continuing to improve their decoding skills we are looking at those comprehension skills which are so important in becoming a confident and fluent reader.

We continue to practise for our showcase, learning actions for the songs and remembering our lines.

In PSHE this week we have been looking at the zones of regulation, identifying our feelings and emotions. We also continue to explore friendships and share what makes a good friend and how we can become one.

We had a fun morning at our 'Woodland Explorers' session as we continued with our litter picking, helping our community. We had another go at hide and seek now the foliage is starting to grow a little more. The children had another go at orienteering and looked at directions, playing a game to help them learn their left and right. They also looked at an artist who uses natural materials (Andy Goldsworthy) and then they had a go at creating their own art. We had great fun in the playground and with the large parachute, the children were able to see for themselves the importance of team work as they tried to keep the balls on the parachute.
