As part of our topic 'Superheroes' this week, the children have made themselves a mask to wear as a superhero and designed a logo for their superhero cape. They then used fabric crayons to draw their design on a piece of cotton. These will then be sewed onto a cape for them by Mrs Bascombe and the children will get to wear them to play in next week before bringing them home. The children also got to review the story book 'Supertato and the Evil Pea', their reviews can be seen in their learning journeys.

This week's handwriting family has been the ladder letter family and as always we have encouraged them to think about their pencil grips, sitting position and anchoring the paper correctly as well as working on how to form those letters.

In maths this week we have been looking at identifying larger and smaller numbers and finding numbers that come in between those numbers. The children also had great fun outside in pretend races where we got to use the ordinal numbers that we are learning. We continued the outdoor theme using natural materials down at the woods on Friday to make repeating patterns.

We continue to practise for our showcase, learning actions for the songs and remembering our lines.

In phonics we have been looking at longer words and compound words and have begun to think about which letters in our alphabet are vowels.

In PSED this week we have been looking at the zones of regulation, identifying our feelings and emotions. We also continue to explore friendships and share what makes a good friend and how we can become one.

On our fourth Friday morning 'Woodland Explorers' session we continued with our litter picking, helping our community. We had another go at hide and seek now the foliage is starting to grow a little more. The children matched up animals and their homes and then had a go at building a shelter for a toy animal. They also looked at an artist who uses natural materials (Andy Goldsworthy) and then they had a go at creating their own art. We had great fun in the playground and with the large parachute, the children were able to see for themselves the importance of team work as they tried to keep the balls on the parachute.

Friday afternoon we joined in the national celebrations for Sir David Attenborough who turned 100! We learnt about his love for our planet and how we can help continue his legacy.
