The children were very excited to get their capes on Monday and loved dressing up with these and the mask they made to show their friends. They then took them home to play with.

We then started to think about some of the real life superheroes that help us in our everyday lives.

The children cut out and put together pictures of four people who help us and wrote a little about what they do. They also matched up the vehicles those superheroes drive to the people. The children have started thinking about a moving vehicle they would like to make next week and painted their box in anticipation.

This week's handwriting family has been the curly caterpillar letter family and as always we have encouraged them to think about their pencil grips, sitting position and anchoring the paper correctly as well as working on how to form those letters.

In maths this week we have been looking at identifying odds and even numbers, revisiting our number bonds to 10 and thinking about directions and position.

We continue to practise for our showcase, learning actions for the songs and remembering our lines.

We had a great dress rehearsal and took photos of everyone in their costumes - the children are very excited to share their hard work with you all next week. Our play is an adaptation of the traditional story 'Little Red Riding Hood', our adaptation celebrates our school values of respect, kindness and diversity. It reminds us not to be scared of things that seem different and that we can all learn and have fun together. We do hope you enjoy it as much as the children are enjoying performing it.

In phonics we have been looking at endings of words, reading words with -ing, -ed and -est on the end.

At our Friday morning 'Woodland Explorers' session we continued with our litter picking, helping our community. We had an even better go at hide and seek now the foliage is starting to grow a little more. The children worked in pairs with the Year 1's to recreate their shelter for a dinosaur from last week - this time it had to be waterproof and we tested them out to see if they were! We spent time in the playground encouraging the children to work together and to think about the importance of thinking through decisions regarding safety (age appropriate). We were also able to spend longer working as a team with our giant parachute. We played several games which only worked if the children all worked as a team. They did really well.
