The children have been exploring money through role play in their café. Thinking about why we have money, where does it come from and how we use it. It is such an important life skill, made more difficult for children these days when very few get to see any cash being used. We have been working on recognising and identifying coins to 10p and beginning to think about coin equivalence.

We have been thinking about pirates and the children made their own treasure map as well as practising their cutting skills to make a pirate picture.

We celebrated 150 years of Baslow St Anne's CofE Primary school this week, sadly due to the extreme heat we had to postpone the children dressing up in Victorian clothes but we will get to do this part of our celebration before the end of term (weather permitting!).

The children have made a wonderful display in our classroom all about our school. The EYFS children drew pictures and wrote about their favourite things to do at school. We also had a video message and letter from the Duke of Rutland and a letter from the Duke of Devonshire (Chatsworth), all sent to celebrate our 150th celebration which we hope to share with the children next week.
