Well done everyone (children and parents) for another great week, the Year 1s really have done brilliantly and we are very proud of them all.

They continue to settle into some new and familiar routines and are working really hard on making that transition from EYFS to Year 1.

They continue to see lots of their Year 1 friends from Leopards, in maths, phonics, topic, science, PSHE, outdoor games and at cross country. In topic they started learning about Victorians, they pooled their knowledge on what they already knew and then what they would like to find out. They completed their topic cover and wrote their own question.

On Tuesday they worked with Miss Pettett and Mrs Booth to make apple crumble. They used the cooking apples from our garden and took their crumble home to cook and share with their families. In science we looked at and discussed the vocabulary for our new topic on 'Animals (including humans)'. We then learnt about and played lots of games to help us learn about animals and their young including the different names they have for their young. We learnt some really interesting words. In maths this week they have been focussing on recapping numbers to 10, including recognising and writing number words, being able to find specific numbers from a group and remembering how to use the 10 frames to make numbers to 10.

The children brought home their first spellings on Friday and a huge thanks in advance for your support in helping them practise these at home over the coming week. Don't forget to bring back to school on Friday for their test. These spellings will really help them in consolidating the phonics they are learning in school.

A huge thanks also to all those who were able to come to the Year 1 meeting in Tigers on Monday - as always we hope you found it useful and welcome any feedback.

We couldn't be prouder of how hard they are working and the great attitudes they are displaying to their work and to being those role models. We know this will continue next week when our new EYFS friends start full time.
